The bearer of this document, travelling on Qantas/Jetstar Group aircraft, has been issued Dangerous Goods Operator (Airline) approval to carry lithium battery powered equipment, including up to two spare batteries provided the following are met.

CARRIAGE REQUIREMENTS (will be verified by a Customer Service/Agent at Check-In)

Portable Electronic Devices

1. The ON/OFF switch on all devices must be protected from turning on e.g. taped
2. Devices are permitted in checked or carry-on baggage.
3. You **must** present this Approval to a Customer Service Agent/Officer every time you check-in.

Spare Batteries

No more than two spare batteries between 101-160Wh are permitted per passenger.

1. All the terminals must be individually protected from short circuiting e.g. taped, individual plastic bags etc.;
2. Spare batteries are only permitted in **carry-on** baggage.

As the passenger, it is your sole responsibility to ensure any additional international/national requirements and any other operator (airline) approvals are obtained prior to travel.
